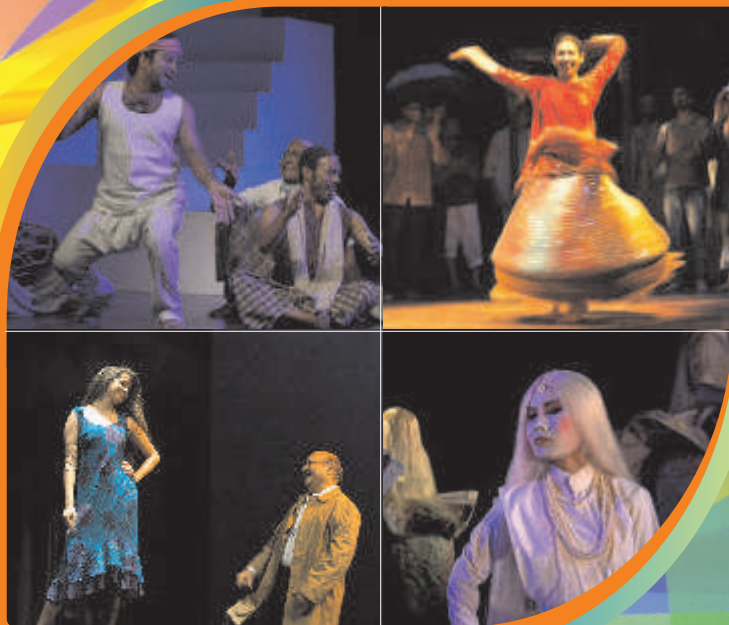

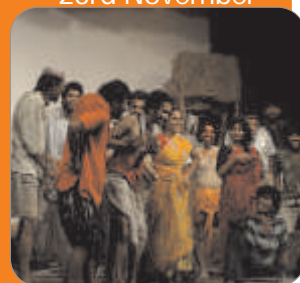

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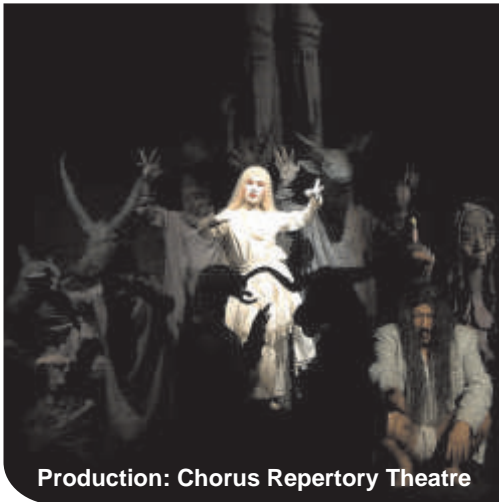

**WHEN WE DEAD AWAKEN** (Ashibagee Eshei) by Ratan Thiyam

People die and go to eternal sleep, never to be awoken again. But Henrik Ibsen's last play says 'When We Dead Awaken'. Arnold Rubek, a sculptor who has made a name of himself through his creations, cannot find peace. He is ill at ease with his wife Maja. She is drawn to Ulfhejm, an uncouth hunter. Irene, a beautiful woman from Rubek's past, enters into his life. She leads him to a mountaintop. An avalanche kills both of them as they approach the summit. In the valley below Maja sings exultantly.

In 'Ashibagee Eshei' Manipuri adaptation of Ibsen's 'When We Dead Awaken' Rubek becomes 'Shaktam Lakpa' or Sculptor; Irene becomes 'Shaktam' or Image; Maja becomes 'Shakhenbi' or Beautiful Woman and Ulfhejm becomes 'Lamlanba' or Stranger.

**VISARJAN** by Bharat Ratna Bhargav

The play visarjan is against the violence practices in the name of religion. A royal priest Raghupati of kali temple preaches sacrifice of innocent animals to fulfill desires and wishes of the common people. The queen, having no issue, comes to the temple to fulfill her wish to get a child. The priest asks her to promise some sacrifices (Bali) of some animals.

A beggar girl Aparna opposes the sacrifice of a goat, to whom she loves like a mother, gets into the conflict with the priest.

The king Govind Manikya finds the sacrifice as entirely inhuman and cruel and orders against the violence in the temple. The conflict between priest and the king is the core theme of the play, especially the conspiracy by the priest in the name of mother goddess.

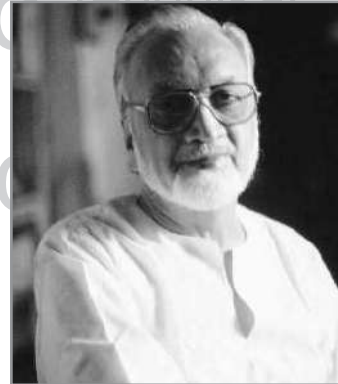
